In the Spotlight

Shortly After a Court Froze Eviction of Salem Family in Sheikh Jarrah, Right-Wing Lawmaker Returns to Provoke Neighborhood, <u>WAFA News</u> Agency, February 23, 2022.

Police fear the evacuation of a Palestinian family for a Jewish settler group could have reignited violence in Jerusalem, particularly due to its timing, just before Ramadan.

Presidency To Israeli Official: No Peace Without a Palestinian State, <u>WAFA</u> <u>News Agency</u>, February 23, 2022.

On Wednesday, February 23, 2022— The Palestinian presidency said that there will be no peace in the region without the establishment of the independent Palestinian state with East Jerusalem as its capital.

Israeli Court Freezes Sheikh Jarrah Eviction Amid Jerusalem Tensions, (by Nir Hasson), <u>HAARETZ</u>, February 22, 2022.

On Wednesday, February 23, 2022 - Less than 24 hours after an Israeli court has frozen an order to evict the Palestinian Salem family from its home in Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood in occupied East Jerusalem, Itamar Bin Gvir, an Israeli right-wing and fascist member of the parliament, the Knesset, returned to the neighborhood to once again incite against its residents and provoke violence.

The executive director of Amnesty International Israel, Molly Malaker, has criticized the group's report labeling Israel as an apartheid state, saying it was a "punch to the gut.

Representatives of the three largest churches in Jerusalem warned the plan was an attempt to 'minimize, not to say eliminate, any non-Jewish characteristics of the Holy City.

On Wednesday, February 23, 2022 – Israeli police detained 14 Palestinian women and four children from the West Bank while they were in occupied East Jerusalem.

Classes at Al-Lubban Al-Sharqiya Village School Disrupted by Soldiers and Settlers for the Third Day, <u>WAFA News Agency</u>, February 23, 2022.



On Wednesday, February 23, 2022— Classes at al-Lubban al-Sharqiya village school, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, were disrupted again and for the third day in a row after Israeli soldiers and settlers blocked the village entrance and prevented the students from reaching their school located off the main Ramallah-Nablus Road.

'The Green Girls' Turn To Agriculture Amid Economic Crisis In Gaza, Mondoweiss, February 22, 2022.

Due to the difficult economic conditions in Gaza two groups of women are turning to agriculture to provide for their families.

Israeli Forces Kill Palestinian Boy, 14, in West Bank, <u>ALJAZEERA</u>, February 22, 2022.

The Palestinian health ministry says Mohammed Shehadeh was killed by Israeli forces' gunfire in Al-Khader area near Bethlehem.

Israeli Occupation Forces Raid Jalazone Refugee Camp in Ramallah, Provoke Confrontations, Detain 10 People, <u>WAFA News Agency</u>, February 22, 2022.

On Tuesday, February 22, 2022— Israeli occupation forces raided Jalazone refugee camp, north of Ramallah, provoking confrontations with residents and detaining 10 people, according to Palestinian security sources.

For The Second Day in A Row, Israeli Settlers, Backed by Soldiers, Disrupt School Day in A West Bank Village, <u>WAFA News Agency</u>, February 22, 2022.

On Tuesday, February 22, 2022, and for the second day in a row, Israeli settlers, backed by soldiers, disrupted studies at al-Lubban al-Sharqiya school, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, when they prevented students from reaching their school located on the main Ramallah-Nablus Road.

The Israeli occupation army detained around 40 Palestinians from various parts of the occupied territories, including blind man, siblings, and fathers and their teenage sons, according to the Palestinian Prisoner Society (PPS) and other sources.

Israeli Settlers, Backed by Soldiers, Attack Students Heading to Their School in A Northern West Bank Village, <u>WAFA News Agency</u>, February 21, 2022.

On Monday, February 21, 2022, Israeli settlers, backed by soldiers, attacked this morning Palestinian students heading to their school in al-Lubban al-Sharqiya village, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, according to witnesses.

International

Interior Minister Discusses with EU Representative Ways of Further Supporting and Strengthening Unilateral Relations, <u>WAFA News Agency</u> February 22, 2022.

On Tuesday, February 22, 2022 – Interior minister Ziad Hab al-Reeh met with the European Union Representative to Palestine, Sven Kuehn von Burgsdorff, in Ramallah, where they discussed ways of further supporting and strengthening the unilateral relations.

PM Shtayyeh To Members of The US Congress: Situation in Palestinian Territories May Lead to Explosion, <u>WAFA News Agency</u> February 21, 2022.

On Monday, February 21, 2022 – Prime Minister Mohammed Shtayyeh said that there is a dangerous political vacuum that may result in the explosion of the situation in the Palestinian territories, stressing that Israel is an expansionist state that bears political responsibility for its actions against the Palestinian people.

More Than 100 Civil Society Organizations Launch A Drive For 1 Million EU Citizens' Signatures To Stop European Trade With Illegal Settlements In Occupied Territories, <u>European Legal Support Center (ELSC)</u>, February 21, 2022.

Such a tactic threatens democratic values and fundamental rights.

On February 17, 2022, and During a high-level policy meeting in Ramallah, the first edition of the European Union – Palestine Investment Review was presented, outlining Team Europe investments at a remarkable amount of EUR 1.42 billion, which forms over 10% of the Palestinian gross domestic product.

Palestinian Refugees and UNRWA

Belgium Supports Palestine Refugees And UNRWA With Early Disbursement Of 2022 Annual Funding Contribution, <u>UNRWA</u>, February 22, 2022.

The Kingdom of Belgium has advanced its annual contribution of EUR 7 million towards the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) 2022 program budget to support the Agency's services to Palestine refugees to the early part of 2022. This crucial and flexible funding is part of a current multi-year agreement between the Kingdom of Belgium and UNRWA totaling EUR 21 million between 2021-2023.



UNRWA To Appoint 750 'Permanent' Teachers In Gaza Over Next Three Years, *THE NEW ARAB*, February 22, 2022.

The UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) announced that 750 teachers will be appointed on fixed-term contracts in the Israeli-blockaded Gaza Strip over the next three years.

UNRWA After School Activities Help Children in Gaza Cope with Stress, *UNRWA*, February 19, 2022.

The psychosocial support UNRWA provides for Gaza children is very essential. It is a basic right for children to live, learn and play in a safe and stimulating environment. Gaza Family Recovers from Traumatic Home Destruction with Help From UNRWA, <u>UNRWA</u>, February 18, 2022.

UNRWA was able to respond to the needs of Palestine refugees directly impacted by the May hostilities thanks to a US\$ 2.5 million grant it received from the UN Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) towards the UNRWA Flash Appeal: Hostilities in Gaza and Mounting Tensions in the West Bank. Of this, approximately 70 percent went towards the TSCA, with the remainder supporting mental health and psychosocial after-school activities and summer school activities in Gaza.

UNRWA Commissioner-General Visits Berlin To Meet Representatives Of New German Government And Parliament, <u>UNRWA</u>, February 17, 2022.

The Commissioner-General of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), Philippe Lazzarini, concluded a three-day visit to Berlin, his first visit to Germany since the national federal elections held on 26 September 2021. The 14-16 February visit aimed to present the critical role UNRWA plays in stabilizing the Middle East to representatives of the newly formed German Parliament and Government and to explore avenues to enhance the partnership between UNRWA and the Federal Republic of Germany, at a critical juncture of the Agency's existence.
