Israel granted official observer status at the African Union, <u>Al-Jazeera</u>, July 23, 2021

Israeli ambassador presents credentials to Moussa Faki Mahamat, chairman of the African Union Commission, at bloc's headquarters in Addis Ababa.

Ben & Jerry's to stop selling ice cream in the West Bank and East Jerusalem, <u>The</u> Week, July 19, 2021

Ben & Jerry's announced it will stop selling its ice cream in the Israeli-occupied West Bank and contested East Jerusalem, saying it is "inconsistent with our values."

Israeli PM: Ben & Jerry's sales ban will have 'serious consequences', The Guardian, July 20, 2021

Bennett's office issued a statement on Tuesday in which it said the prime minister had spoken to Unilever's chief executive, Alan Jope, about what he called a "clearly anti-Israel step", adding that the move would have "serious consequences, legal and otherwise, and that [Israel] will act aggressively against all boycott actions directed against its citizens".
