Latest Developments

Palestinian lawyer confident of stopping Jerusalem evictions, <u>Arab News</u>, May 04, 2021

Lawyers and activists trying to prevent the eviction of some 87 Palestinian residents from their homes in the Sheikh Jarrah district of Jerusalem appeared to be upbeat this week.

"We sat for hours with the judge and each of us gave suggestions to settle the case," Hussein said. "Our suggestion is that we deposit the rental money for the units to a secure fund at the court until the real owner of the land — the housing units were built in the 1950s — is determined."

Israeli Supreme Court Postpones Ruling on Sheikh Jarrah Evictions, <u>Palestine</u> <u>Chronicle</u>, May 07, 2021

The Israeli Supreme Court postponed Thursday its ruling on the eviction of several Palestinian families from the occupied East Jerusalem neighborhood of Sheikh Jarrah until May 10.

Palestinians had called for Jordan to release official papers and documents to prove their ownership. In April, Jordanian Minister of Foreign Affairs Ayman Safadi handed over documents proving Palestinian ownership of their properties in Sheikh Jarrah, in a bid to prevent a new mass eviction.

Twenty-two Palestinians were wounded in overnight clashes with Israeli police in annexed east Jerusalem, the Red Crescent said Thursday, as tensions flare over a controversial land rights case.



Israeli settlers attack Palestinian following shooting of Israeli students in West Bank, *Al-Monitor*, May 03 2021

The attack took place around noon local time in the town of Far'ata west of the Palestinian city Nablus in the central West Bank. A group of settlers from the nearby Havat Gilad outpost allegedly physically assaulted Mohammad Salman while he was grazing livestock on his property. He went to the hospital due to injuries, the Palestinian Authority's official WAFA News Agency reported.

"If I don't steal your home, someone else will steal it," was the answer given by an Israeli settler to Mona al-Kurd, a young Palestinian woman who accused him of stealing her home in the Sheikh Jarrah neighbourhood in the occupied East Jerusalem.

Yosef Elitzur received a four-month suspended sentence for his inflammatory opinion pieces; state prosecutors want nine to 12 months either in prison or community service. The maximum is five years behind bars

Palestinian fears rise as settlers visit synagogue ruins in Jericho, <u>Al-Monitor</u>, May 03, 2021

Israeli settlers have been increasing their visits to the ruins of the ancient Naaran and Shahwan synagogues in the Jericho area in the West Bank and also performing rituals in them, sparking Palestinian fears about Israeli intentions for the region.

"The occupying power ... cannot confiscate private property in occupied territory." Transferring civilian populations into occupied territory is illegal under international law and "may amount to war crimes", he added.

A United Nations arbitrations committee is poised to examine a Palestinian Authority complaint that Israel has committed acts of apartheid.

Israel Has Been Conducting a Secretive Land Registration Process in Sheikh Jarrah, Excluding Palestinians, *IR Amim*, May 04, 2021

For the first time in 53 years, Israel has underhandedly began land registration procedures in East Jerusalem, exclusively registering land rights of properties to alleged Jewish owners without the public's knowledge. Such a move is unprecedented and has potential acute ramifications on Palestinian properties across East Jerusalem, which could ultimately lead to widespread Palestinian dispossession in the city.

Report: Captive Markets, Captive Lives | Palestinian Workers in Israeli Settlements, *Al-Haq NGO*, May 01, 2021

The report examines the experiences of Palestinian workers in Israel's unlawful settlement enterprise in the Occupied Palestinian Territory (OPT). Al-Haq illustrates Israel's reliance on the Oslo Accords to maintain control over the occupied Palestinian population and deepen their fragmentation, while holding the Palestinian economy captive, in what amounts to 'economic annexation'.

Palestinians: A land without promise, <u>Rosalux Geneva</u>, Jan 18, 2021

One sequence of historical wrongs – antisemitism in Europe, culminating in the horrors of the Holocaust – led to the creation of Israel. But that gave birth to another set of wrongs: the displacement of Palestinians from their homes and their homeland. The Palestinian diaspora still has no hope of return, and many are still not accepted in the places where they live.

Palestinian access to water & attacks on WASH structures in Area C, <u>West Bank</u> Protection Consortium, Apr 2021

In addition, WASH infrastructures in Area C are not immune from the ever-present threat of demolitions and confiscations, facilitated by Israel's implementation of a discriminatory planning policy. In 2020, less than 1 percent of Area C was allocated for Palestinian development by the Israeli Civil Administration (ICA). These highly restrictive planning policies and the associated destruction of private property and humanitarian assistance deny communities access to affordable and safe water, including hygiene and sanitation facilities.
