Latest Developments:

Terrified families huddle together in Gaza as Eid festivities turn into nights of death and destruction, <u>CNN</u>, May 14, 2021

Gaza residents, according to social media testimony, have been calling their families abroad to send their Eid greetings, and also to say farewell, just in case they didn't survive the night.

Israel-Gaza: Strike collapses building during live BBC report, <u>BBC</u>, May 14, 2021 BBC Arabic reporter Adnan Elbursh and his team kept broadcasting, unaware of what was about to happen.

Hamas scrambles to learn how Israel killed its military leaders hiding in secret locations, *Al-Monitor*, May 14, 2021

After Israel targeted and killed several of Hamas' military leaders, the organization has grown more concerned about Israel succeeding in breaching the movement's secret communications system.

Woman, 50, pronounced dead after falling during rush to bomb shelter, <u>Times of</u> <u>Israel</u>, May 14, 2021

The death toll in Israel since the fighting started has thus reached nine, including an 87-year-old woman who slipped and fell last night while sirens warned of rockets fired by terrorists in the Gaza Strip.

Two International Activists Injured in Jewish Settler's Aggression near Hebron, <u>Palestine Chronicle</u>, May 14, 2021

Coordinator of the Protection and Steadfastness Committee in Masafer Yatta, Fuad al-Amour, said that a group of Jewish settlers used stones and batons to beat a number of Palestinian herders and international solidarity activists in She'b al-'Inbiya area, wounding two activists in the head and destroying their vehicle.

Israel says no troops in Gaza, cites communication error, Arab News, May 14, 2021

The Israeli army clarified early Friday that its troops had not entered the Gaza Strip as it had earlier stated, blaming an "internal communication" problem for the confusion.



AOC compares treatment of Palestinians to conditions at US southern border, <u>FOX NEWS</u>, May 14, 2021

Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, D-NY, stepped up her criticism of the Biden administration's handling of an escalating military conflict between Israel and Hamas militants Thursday, likening the conditions experienced by Palestinians in the region to conditions experienced by migrant children at the southern border.

Israel Intensifies Attack on Gaza as Ground Troops Join Offensive, <u>Voice of America</u>, May 14, 2021

Israel has added ground troops to its offensive against Palestinian militants, escalating fears that the five-day old conflict could tip over into all-out war. An Israeli military spokesman said Israel has used 160 warplanes and three brigades of ground troops and their tanks in the attack.

How Israeli police are colluding with settlers against Palestinian citizens, <u>+972</u> <u>Magazine</u>, May 13, 2021

West Bank settlers swarmed the city of Lyd on Wednesday, where they threw stones and attacked Palestinian residents. Israeli forces who were supposed to enforce a curfew stood idly by.

Israel's army unleashed a wider military attack on Gaza Thursday night, inaugurating a new phase in a conflict that has claimed dozens of lives in the last several days.

Israel destroys Gaza media offices, *Electronic Intifada*, May 13, 2021

Israel has leveled several multi-story buildings in Gaza City that housed the offices of more than a dozen international and local media outlets, as well as apartments housing dozens of families.

Israel's "change bloc" collapses, leaving Netanyahu in charge, <u>AXIOS</u>, May 13, 2021

In a dramatic shift that comes amid fighting in the Gaza strip and clashes between Jewish and Arab citizens in Israel, right-wing kingmaker Naftali Bennett has announced he will no longer seek an alternative government to oust Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

Israel: Jewish and Arab mobs spread violence, BBC, May 13, 2021



After vandalising Arab-owned property in the city - including the ice cream parlour Victory - the mob turned on the driver on the beachfront promenade. While they said the man was trying to ram them in his car, camera footage shows him trying to reverse away from and then speed past the violent crowd.

Street violence terrorizes Israeli cities, Al-Monitor, May 13, 2021

At least 374 people were arrested by Israeli authorities in relation to protests in mixed Jewish-Arab areas Wednesday night and Thursday morning, according to Arab48. The violence continued on Thursday. In the predominantly Arab town of Kafr Qasim, Israeli police used tear gas against protesters. The protesters burned an Israeli police car, reported Palestinian news outlet Ma'an.

Israel police brace for more violence from far-right groups, <u>Al-Monitor</u>, May 13, 2021

Israel's public broadcaster reports that groups of far-right militants are organizing in the towns that experienced clashes between Jews and Arabs last night. The militants are planning to gather in the centers of Bat Yam, Jerusalem, Haifa and Jaffa. Other reports say far-right militants are organizing on Telegram, calling for demonstrations against Arabs and even violence. The far-right group Lehava said it will distribute pepper spray and tear gas to its activists next week.

Shocking video captured a crowd of ultra-nationalist Israelis pulling an Arab driver from a car and beating him until he lay motionless on the ground – as Israel's President Reuven Rivlin said the country was being gripped by a civil war that's the result of long-simmering tensions between the nation's Arabs and Jews reignited by this week's Gaza bloodshed.

"Hamas missiles are the least of our problems for a country in which Jewish and Arab rioters take to the street to lynch civilians."

Thousands of protesters in Jordan, Israel's eastern neighbor, marched toward the border on Friday morning, chanting slogans in solidarity with the Palestinians and waving Palestinian flags as Jordanian riot police surrounded them.

The 120 US military personnel were visiting for a planning conference ahead of a joint exercise with Israeli forces.

The Institute for Middle East Understanding (IMEU), a pro-Palestinian group, is one of the most reposted sources for infographics, with 253,000 followers for its Instagram infographics with titles like "Private U.S. Money Funds Ethnic Cleansing in Palestine" and others that compile, curate and explain videos such as those posted by @eye.on.palestine. Defending Israel are accounts such as @the.israel.files.

Despite Gaza rockets, Israelis most concerned over internal Jewish-Arab rift, <u>Al-Monitor</u>, May 14, 2021

The coexistence between Arabs and Jews will face one of its greatest challenges. Chairman of the Hamas Political Bureau and de facto head of the Gaza Strip Ismail Haniyeh uses Twitter to glorify child "martyrs" among other things. Considered second in command of Hamas, Mousa Mohammed Abu Marzook also uses Twitter to encourage violence against Israel, saying, "Do not coexist with the occupation," to his more than 360,000 followers.

Republican lawmakers were quick to blame the Democratic president for not helping to avert the violence, including barrages of rocket attacks launched at Israel from Gaza. All four children came from the same family, two siblings and two cousins. They were under the age of twelve and were known to the Agency as they went to UNRWA schools. Our hearts go out to their families and friends in communities that have been so cruelly affected by this latest escalation.

Matthias Schmale, Director of Operations of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) in the Gaza Strip, and Lucia Elmi, UNICEF Special Representative in the State of Palestine, said in a joint statement that the conflict has a profound and long-lasting impact on children.

NRWA joins other UN entities in raising alarm over eight Sheikh Jarrah families, approximately 75 persons in total, residing in the same-named neighborhood of East Jerusalem that are at risk of imminent forced eviction, placing them at heightened risk of forcible transfer.

Israel can't impose its own laws to evict Palestinians, UN rights group says, <u>Middle</u> <u>East Monitor</u>, May 10, 2021

In a press release published by the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, Colville emphasised that East Jerusalem remains part of the occupied Palestinian territory, in which International Humanitarian Law applies, given the "disturbing" scenes in Sheikh Jarrah.

UNRWA Deputy Commissioner-General Leni Stenseth concludes first visit to Syria, calls for increased services for Palestine refugees, Yarmouk Camp, <u>UNRWA</u>, May 07, 2021

During her visits to the Sbeineh and Yarmouk camps in Rif Damascus, Ms. Stenseth witnessed the extreme hardship and increasing needs of Palestine refugees. In Sbeineh, she talked to staff who
