In the Spotlight

PM Shtayyeh Urges the Netherlands to Pressure Israel to Allow Elections in Jerusalem, WAFA News Agency, May 18, 2022.

Prime Minister Mohammed Shtayyeh urged the Netherlands to pressure Israel to allow Palestinian elections to be held in Jerusalem and to release the bodies of Palestinians it has been holding.

Foreign Ministry Condemns Israel's Provocative 'Flag March' in Jerusalem, WAFA News Agency, May 18, 2022.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates condemned today the decision of the Israeli Public Security Minister, Omer Bar-Lev, to allow the so-called "flags march" in Jerusalem, and its passage through Bab al-Amoud (Damascus Gate) on May 29.

Foreign Ministry Accuses the Israeli Premier of Inciting Violence Against the Palestinian People, <u>WAFA News Agency</u>, May 18, 2022.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates today criticized statements by Israeli Prime Minister Naftali Bennett in which he called on his army and police to use excessive force against the Palestinians wherever they are, saying such statements are incitement to violence against the Palestinian people.

Civil Society Organizations Welcome Submission on Behalf of Human Rights Defender Salah Hammouri to the ICC, <u>WAFA News Agency</u>, May 17, 2022.

National, regional, and international civil society organizations welcomed the communication submitted to the Office of the Prosecutor (OTP) of the International Criminal Court (ICC) on behalf of 37-year-old Palestinian-French Jerusalemite, long-time human rights defender, and lawyer Salah Hammouri, which details years of persecution and new tactics to forcibly transfer Palestinians from occupied Jerusalem.

More than 70 Palestinians were wounded in overnight confrontations with Israeli forces at a Jerusalem funeral, Palestinian medics said Tuesday.

A number of US congress members Monday introduced to the US House a bill that recognizes the Palestinian Nakba, the forced expulsion and ethnic cleansing of some 750,000 Palestinians by the Zionists 74 years ago and turning them into refugees to establish a Jewish-majority state in Palestine.

The Catholic archbishop in Jerusalem on Monday strongly criticized Israel's "police invasion" last week of a Christian hospital ahead of the funeral of slain Al Jazeera reporter Shireen Abu Akleh.

"The story of the Israeli side does not hold water, it is fictitious and it is not in line with reality and we do not accept to have an investigation on this issue with those who are the criminals," Mansour told reporters at the UN headquarters in New York on Wednesday.

The European Union announced a three-year multi-year contribution of EUR 246 million to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine refugees in the Near East (UNRWA). In a key meeting on the margins of the Brussels IV Conference on 'Supporting the future of Syria and the region', UNRWA Commissioner-General Philippe Lazzarini met with the European Commissioner for Neighborhood and Enlargement Olivér Várhelyi to discuss the vital services the Agency delivers to Palestine refugees impacted by the ongoing conflict in Syria and across the Middle East.

Waving the Palestinian Flag Falls Under Freedom of Expression (by Haaretz Editorial), <u>HAARETZ</u>, May 17, 2022.

Police Commissioner Kobi Shabtai rushed to order an investigation into police officers' conduct during the funeral of Al Jazeera reporter Shireen Abu Akleh. But, in addition to looking into the officers' use of excessive force, a thorough investigation is needed of the order given the officers by Jerusalem police chief Doron Turgeman to confiscate Palestinian flags and prevent them from being waved during the funeral as reported by Josh Breiner in Monday's Haaretz.

Killing of Shireen Abu Akleh is Potentially a War Crime (Francesca Albanese), ARAB NEWS, May 17, 2022.

The killing of Shireen Abu Akleh was particularly heavy to process and comment on. Like many, I learned about Palestine through her eyes and fact-based reporting since the days of the Second Intifada. Shireen Abu Akleh, a veteran al-Jazeera journalist, was a fixture on Palestinian and Arab TV screens for more than two decades. Intrepid, sympathetic, intelligent and trustworthy, she had reported on developments in the occupied territories since the late 1990s. She was shot dead by the Israeli military in the early morning of 11 May. There was shock, grief and outrage throughout Palestine and the Middle East. Israel has killed more than forty-five journalists since 2000, but the case of Abu Akleh has taken the practice to an entirely new level.

Not only was she equipped with a helmet and bulletproof vest (marked by letters clearly spelling out the word "press" outlined in bright white) — she also had accreditation from the Israeli authorities, meaning that she was fully entitled to carry out her job as a reporter for the Qatar-based network Al Jazeera.
