About Tawasol Network

The Tawasol Network is a collaborative platform established to advance women’s meaningful engagement in crisis prevention, preparedness, and response under Jordan’s Women, Peace and Security (WPS) agenda. Building on early localization efforts in southern Jordan, the Arab Renaissance for Democracy and Development (ARDD) and UN Women Jordan expanded and strengthened Tawasol in 2025 to serve as a structured platform contributing directly to the implementation of the Second Jordanian National Action Plan for UNSCR 1325 (JONAP II). Through this phase, Tawasol evolved into a coordinated platform that advances the decentralization of JONAP II, enhances women’s meaningful participation in crisis prevention, preparedness, and response, and strengthens linkages between local women-led, youth-led, and persons with disabilities–led organizations and national WPS processes. With support from the JONAP Pooled Fund, the Network reinforces local leadership and technical capacities, promotes gender-responsive and inclusive crisis management, and contributes to coherent and sustainable civil society engagement in Jordan’s peace and security agenda.

The network aims to strengthen linkages and foster coordination among these organizations, providing a platform for capacity development, advocacy, and collaboration in key areas such as crisis prevention, climate change adaptation, and social cohesion. By enhancing their technical capabilities and ensuring their active participation in decision-making processes, Tawasol aims to empower these organizations to play a more significant role in crisis management and community resilience efforts.

Tawasol is closely aligned with the [Jordan National NGOs Forum \(JONAF\)](#), a coalition co-founded by ARDD in 2016, leveraging JONAF’s platform to expand outreach, increase visibility, and amplify advocacy efforts at national and international levels.

Additionally, Tawasol aligns with [Al-Nahda Women’s Network](#). The institutionalization of capacity-building efforts through Tawasol will also allow for expanding training opportunities to actors in northern governorates, including CSOs and CBOs that are already part of Al-Nahda Women’s Network or JONAF. This expansion will facilitate broader connections, potential collaborations, and exchanges among these organizations.

Tawasol also aligns with JONAP Civil Society Organizations (CSO) Forum, as part of JONAP Governance Structure, serves as a structured national platform bringing together local CSOs that voluntarily commit to supporting the implementation of the National Action Plans, in line with defined membership criteria. The Forum plays a strategic role in shaping and advancing the WPS agenda by contributing to JONAPs development, supporting implementation through aligned programmes and initiatives, and promoting awareness and capacity-building on UNSCR 1325. The Forum enhances coherence and complementarity across stakeholders and supports sustainable and coordinated civil society contributions to national peace and security priorities.

Tawasol works closely with national and international partners to ensure that crisis management and development efforts remain localized and decentralized, strengthening the role of women and youth-led organizations in shaping sustainable and inclusive solutions.



Jordan National NGOs Forum (JONAF)

The Jordan National NGOs Forum (JONAF) was established in 2016 through an initiative led by the Arab Renaissance for Democracy and Development (ARDD), in cooperation with a coalition of civil society organizations, community-based organizations, as well as a group of experts and media activists.
